

SHKP-Kwoks' Foundation meets with representatives of various universities

Hong Kong, 17 October, 2023: The SHKP-Kwoks' Foundation is committed to building close ties with different universities to cultivate talent for the country. With the pandemic now ended, the Foundation has endeavored to cultivate stronger connections with the beneficiary universities. Recently, a delegation from Peking University visited Hong Kong, and representatives from the Foundation embarked on visits to several mainland universities to exchange views on educational support.
